Priya: Welcome to Here to Judge where we scour the internet to dissect dilemmas and decide who's to blame. Here to Judge today is me, Priya Hall.

Robin: Me, Robin Morgan.

Leila: And me, Leila Navabi.

Robin: 'Would I be the asshole if I burned the quilt my grandma made me? My Grandmother a while back made me female, 26 and soon to be ex husband, male 30, a quilt, but due to the pandemic I was unable to receive her gift. Now that I'm vaccinated and work from home I was able to visit to see her. In the midst of catching up she asked me to follow her and handed me the folded quilt and told me she meant for it to be for me and my ex, but she's still happy that I was finally able to get it.

Priya: Oh I can't wait to see this.

Leila: It thinks it's one of those things where like if a psychotherapist held it up in front of you and was like

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'What do you see?' If you see swastikas that says more about you than it does the grandma'.

Robin: No.

Priya: I don't know this looks very, that's a swastika.

Leila: Really?

Robin: You can all see loads of dicks right? You can see loads of dicks? [laughs]

Priya: [Laughs] That is 100% a swastika.

Leila: Oh actually, do you know what? On your phone when you're holding it up to me, I see blue swastikas. When I was in there, I could just see the white outlines, do you see what I mean?

Priya: Oh.

Leila: The dress yeah.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah my kids, that's a photo of my kids.

Leila: Something feels even weirder about burning it to me than just like.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Why didn't you just like make it something else?

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- Priya: Or just tell your grandma that she's knitted a swastika quilt for you.
- Leila: Oh no because she probably didn't mean it unless she did in which case burn your grandma [laughs].
- Priya: Yeah.
- Robin: Wrap her in a quilt.
- Leila: Oh my god! [Laughs]
- Priya: We've got to have these conversations, when to burn my grandma.
- Leila: Yeah, yeah.
- Robin: Yeah wrap her up like she's a big spliff and just set her alight.
- Leila: Yeah, yeah. I mean it depends. I bet she probably didn't mean it. It sounds to me like this woman thinks that she didn't mean it right?
- Robin: Yeah.
- Leila: It's not like my nan's a twat. It's like oh what an awful faux pas. But burning it is so like...
- Priya: Yeah.
- Robin: I'd love to see a Reddit post, 'Is my nan the twat?'
- Priya: Almost always, yes.
- Robin: A whole new subsection. Yes she's a racist Nazi, yes. I mean it's 100% swastikas. Oh there's an update.
- Priya: The update.
- Robin: We haven't had an update in ages. 'First off, this has definitely gotten bigger than I expected this to go, and good golly y'all' Jesus Christ, I think they should burn the OP. 'Good golly y'all thanks for all the advice and tips. I

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talked with my grandma' good 'but didn't point out the pattern I more so asked her questions about the process. Boy howdy' Is this update done by the same person? Has a cowboy stolen her computer? 'Boy howdy, bless her heart she worked on this quilt for about a year.' From 1939 to 1940.

Leila: Oh my god Robin!

Robin: 'For about a year. For what happened, initially she made blocks (three stripes) which came out to be over 40ish squares, but she didn't have enough material so she added the white borders that sep?'

Leila: I'm sure separate is the word.

Robin: I'm sure that's that what it was but I'm imagining that the OK. - Leila: No.

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Leila: And the fact that it says 'I talked with my family about what happened and they all agreed she didn't mean to do this and it was an honest mistake'. The way that's phrased makes it sound like it was a possibility that she was just doing it deliberately.

Robin: Oh yeah.

Leila: I think they need to modify it.

Priya: There's no one in my family that there would be this element of doubt for me. No one in my family would give me something swastika based and I'd be like, they don't know their swastika or they've intended for it to be swastikas.

Leila: No. Yes. Yeah.

Priya: You need to have a word with your grandma that goes beyond 'What's going on?' You need to get into the guts of it.

Leila: Yeah, yeah.

Priya: Well make them like little windows.

Leila: Yeah true, yes.

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: Crafting is not hard you guys.

Leila: What are the paintings of is the question?

Leila: We'll say, I think you're weird. I think your nan is weird. I think you're just like a weird little family.

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Priya: I think you need to have a word with your nan.

Leila: I don't think her nan meant it.

Robin: Yeah I think so.

Priya: The nan can fix it.

Leila: Yeah, the nan will fix it yeah.

Priya: If that was me...

Robin: That would be a nice project wouldn't it?

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Yeah that's true.

Priya: [Laughs] Anti swastikaing your quilt.

Leila: Yeah. But you can't exactly take it to anyone else can you?

Priya: No.

Leila: So it's either sew it yourself. Get your nan to do it. And then the option is take it to like you know.

Robin: So this hasn't happened, this is a hypothetical, would the OP be the asshole if she burnt grandma's shall ya'll?

Priya: I think she'd be the asshole because it's a year in the making, that being said, she cannot leave the quilt as it is, she needs to have a word with her grandma and get her to amend the swastikas into literally anything else.

Robin: You could just like dye the entire thing like one black colour.

Priya: Sure, yeah.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: Yeah.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: This what I was imaging but then.

Robin: You talented mother fucker!

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Leila: God, I mean look also similarly, I am a crier. So for me that's a level of like no. There is a moment, I don't know again this all feels very misogynistic but I would be a bit irritated if someone cried. And like shrieking.

Priya: I don't mind a silent tear.

Robin: I think shrieking is it.

Priya: As someone who cries frequently, a silent tear is fine. If you're by your own admission screaming then no it's unacceptable.

Leila: Every time. It's every time.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: Then it's about you isn't it? It's not about the art.

- Robin: No.
- Leila: No.

- Leila: Yes, yes I have, yes! Yes!
- Priya: My god, if I think too long about Nim I start crying.
- Leila: No Nim. Poor Nim.
- Priya: Nim.
- Leila: Wasn't the sentence like the most ridiculous thing ever. It was like 'Nim wants banana, Nim wants the banana, if you don't give Nim the banana, Nim banana, yes please'. It was something like that.
- Priya: Nim's going to fuck you up!
- Leila: [Laughs] Oh but yeah it was really wrong, I don't know.
- Priya: Yeah.
- Leila: Yeah everything. I haven't watched Toy Story 3 still to this day because I know what Toy Story 2 did me.
- Robin: Oh man. Yeah.

Leila: No, yeah. I don't think she needs to change her ways which is what she's suggested. I think she just needs to not, like just know when to leave. Because it's not good for her. - Robin: Booze.

- Leila: [Laughs] Your plasma screen.
- Robin: [Laughs]
- Leila: I actually love that.

Leila: It's bigger than that. You can get guns in Wal-Mart.

Priya: Yeah.
