Robin: Welcome to Here to Judge where we scour the internet to dissect dilemmas and decide who's to blame. Here to Judge today is me, Robin Morgan.

Leila: Me, Leila Navabi.

Priya: And me, Priya Hall.

'Am I the asshole for being uncomfortable with my girlfriend being naked around her dog? My 33 male, girlfriend 30, hates clothes. To the point where she has actively researched nudist colonies and if it wasn't for having to occasionally go into the office, she would have moved there long before she met me. So, she's always naked around the house. Which, for me? It's hella nice.' I hate hella.

Leila: Oh my god.

Priya: 'She's got a rockin' bod.' Oh no.

Robin: Do you rockin' more than hella? I do [laughs].

Priya: [Laughs] I hate both of them just as much.

Leila: Ugh.

Priya: 'The issue is her two year old dog. The dog is a super cute and fluffy great Pyrenees, very well trained, 10/10 a good girl. My girlfriend was there when her friend brought the heavily pregnant mum home from the pound, was there at the birth, and fell in love immediately. Robin: Yes you are.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Why are you jealous of a dog?

Robin: [Laughs]

Priya: Like is he genuinely concerned she's going to fuck the dog?

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah bitter.

Leila: It sounds like that. When he's like beautiful Pyrenees or whatever, Paranaise I don't know why I was calling it Nando's Paranaise.

Priya: Paranaise [laughs]

Robin: Yeah [laughs].

Leila: She's fluffy, lovely, beady eyed. Like she's gonna...

Priya: Beady eyed [laughs].

Leila: ...like do you fancy this dog? Because that's what it sounds like.

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- Robin: I mean she's 10/10 a good girl. I think he does fancy the dog, 100%.
- Priya: But does she have a rockin' bod? That's the real question.
- Robin: Yeah [laughs].
- Leila: And like the idea that the only reason she'd want to be naked is like for sexual reasons when clearly that is.
- Robin: For his pleasure.
- Leila: Yeah. Like no.
- Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.
- Priya: Ugh [sighs].
- Robin: It's so gross isn't it? Just like yeah I love it when she's naked but now this fuckin' chick has got in the middle of us. It's so gross. It's such a your body is for my own pleasure and that's it.
- Leila: Yeah it's a hella rockin' bod.
- Priya: Yeah [hurling noise]
- Leila: So what if she had a horrible body? What happens then like? Would you not be afraid of the dog then? Would then it be?
- Priya: [Laughs]
- Robin: Well they'd just be chilling with the dog just discussing it.
- Priya: It would be less temptation for the dog.
- Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah exactly. They'd just have a side bar. Her body is not hella nice, it's not hella nice at all.
- Priya: [Laughs]

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Leila: The issue is the two-year-old dog. The issue is you! How can you not see this?

Priya: Yeah. Was the dog there before him?

Leila: Sounds like it doesn't it?

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Playing with the dog naked. Cuddling on the couch naked. Like we get it she likes being naked around her house. I think that's absolutely fine. It's your fucking house.

Priya: This is someone who was brought up in a really repressive household where showing any part of your body was seen as being lewd.

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: Relax! In my opinion.

Leila: Yeah no seriously.

Robin: I just love the sentence 'my girlfriend hates clothes'.

Priya: [Laughs] Don't we all? Look don't we all.

Robin: What a start.

Leila: Like why is he so afraid?

Robin: I mean it literally comes down to, are you jealous of a dog?

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: And that's the base level of it.

Priya: Maybe it's because the dog is better than him and to be fair she does sound better than him.

Robin: [Draws breath shocked] There is an edit.

Leila: OK go on give it to us.

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Priya: 'Edit- Wow, I stepped away to make and eat dinner, and this blew up. I wasn't expecting this many things.' Bad grammar but OK. 'To answer questions, no, I'm not a troll, and I'm not jealous of a literal female dog. I know my girlfriend isn't doing anything'...

Leila: A male dog however!

Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: She's not gay!

Robin: Boys will be boys.

Leila: Yeah. Sorry continue.

Priya: [Laughs] 'I know my girlfriend isn't doing anything but it's still weird. I do see being naked as sexual, since the only times I'm fully naked is when I'm showering or well, having sex. I respect that my girlfriend doesn't feel the same way, but I'll get up to use the bathroom or something and come back and the dog in my spot on the couch asleep with her head on my girlfriend's naked thigh. That's just so weird? How is it not?'

Leila: Because it's not.

Priya: Definitely jealous of the dog.

Robin: Because you and your girlfriend have a different relationship to her and her dog.

Priya: Yeah right? [laughs].

Leila: Yeah that's really strange to me.

Priya: Do you reckon this person is a never nude?

Robin: Oh! Maybe.

Priya: Have you seen Arrested Development?

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Leila: No.

Priya: There's a character in it who is a never nude.

Leila: What's a never nude?

Priya: Which means that he never wants to be naked and always is wearing a pair of jean shorts under his clothes so when he showers he wears jean shorts.

Leila: Why jean shorts?!

Priya: When he has sex he wears jean shorts.

Leila: Why not like cotton shorts?

Priya: I mean he's not a real person in fairness.

Leila: OK fine.

Priya: But I think that's what this person is.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: Never nude. Yeah but to shower. Like 'I see being naked as a sexual thing, the only time I'm naked is when I'm showering' What? Hello. Like why is that necessarily?

Robin: Yeah showering or having sex. Like immediately after the shower put on some underwear. You know what I mean like? There's surely more times.

Priya: This person has never seen himself naked in a full length mirror, I can guarantee that. I can feel this in my bones.

Leila: I also wonder if he's ever lived alone? Or do you know what I mean? Like prior to this relationship.

Priya: Yeah. Maybe he's just come from his repressive family into this household?

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Leila: Yeah or even like with flatmates. I will say that I'm definitely naked a lot more now that I live just with my partner than when I was living with flatmates. Obviously.

Priya: Yes.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: But that doesn't mean, I'm naked around my cat sometimes and he really does not give a flagrant fuck at all.

Priya: If anything they're a bit like well yeah finally you are as you are meant to be.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: Yeah like why are you wearing this cloth upon my body.

Robin: Because frankly you look ridiculous.

Leila: [Laughs] Yeah I know.

Priya: What a silly little costume.

Leila: Yeah [laughs].

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah. What fancy dress is it today?

Priya: [Laughs]

Robin: I love the fact that the dog goes straight up to his spot though. Because dogs are really good tells in terms of like red flags, they're like this guy is a wrong 'un.

Priya: This is her giving warnings to her owner being like, this dude is a weirdo.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah. Hey watch how he reacts when I do this.

Priya: [Laughs]

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Robin: Again, any sentence where you have to say 'no I'm not a troll' like you probably [laughs].

Leila: No.

Robin: You're a wrong 'un, you're awful.

Priya: I think they should break up, obviously.

Robin: Obviously. 100%

Priya: Obviously. She should run away with the dog immediately.

Leila: He's one of these that like hates breastfeeding in public.

Priya: Oh for sure. For sure.

Robin: It's natural but don't put it in my face.

Leila: What is wrong with you?! Yeah, big, big asshole go away. Horrible man.

Robin: This is one of the biggest assholes we've had in a while.

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: Yeah so unreasonable and then standing by it when clearly loads of people are being like, you're jealous of a dog.

Robin: I love taking the side of a dog.

Priya: Yeah. Obviously we would take the side of a dog. The fact that they go, I'm not jealous of a little female dog and then describe all of the ways in which they're jealous of the female dog.

Robin: Yeah [laughs].

Leila: I'm not jealous. Yeah. I hate, yeah. Je deteste.

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Robin: I think anyone seeing naked as sexual and therefore your partner's female body as purely sexual, that's such a red flag.

Leila: And as your property that like.

Robin: Yeah totally, totally, that's it. Asshole. I hope the dog eats him alive.

Leila: Yeah I do.

Priya: Well she's 10/10 good girl so she's absolutely gonna.

Robin: Yeah

Leila: I hope the dog sucks him off.

Priya: Oh my God [laughs].

Leila: [Laughs] Yeah of course this dog's heterosexuality just overcame her. She was waiting outside the shower.

Priya: He was in the shower minding this own business.

Leila: For one second where he was naked.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah and she went for it!

Leila: That's horrible. I'm really sorry [laughs hysterically] I'm going to get cancelled. OK.

Priya: This one brought out the worst in us. Good.

Leila: Yeah it really did didn't it? Awful people.

Robin: Oh goodness me [laughs].

Leila: Good.

[Here to Judge Interim Music]

Leila: 'Am I the asshole for cleaning out the fridge without telling my husband? My darling husband brought home a metal box that he checks on often during the day when

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it's in the fridge. When asked about it, He said it contained freshly picked olives his friend Jason got from his uncle's farm and wanted darling husband to keep until he gets back from his business trip. I had no problem with him keeping it safe at the bottom of the fridge. Darling husband always asks me to be cautious with the box and not open it as it would be rude to touch other people's stuff. Yesterday I decided to clean out the fridge which took me about two hours from unplugging the fridge, emptying all items, groceries, vegetables and containers. Leila: Part of my brain went, wedding ring?

Priya: [Laughs] In some box that needs to be refrigerated?

Leila: Well?

Robin: But it's such a mad double triple bluff that it could be something like that.

Priya: Do you think? I don't think it's worth verbally abusing your wife to try and keep a wedding ring secret.

Robin: Yeah.

Leila: But that's what always happens in films Priya.

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- Priya: Maybe this is fine as long as you get presents at the end!
- Leila: Yeah I think yeah.
- Robin: Yeah Hollywood would not lie to us, it's fine.
- Leila: No never.
- Robin: It is something worrying isn't it?
- Leila: I don't think I've ever seen a metal box. Like a metal box?
- Priya: I'm thinking like a safe. You know you can get like small safes. That's what I'm picturing in my head.
- Leila: Hmm?
- Robin: Yeah I'm picturing a sort of like the kind of thing that in a bad '90s action film would have like uranium in it and Gary Oldman would be there but doing a bad offensive accent.
- Priya: Sure.
- Robin: He's a good actor.
- Leila: True. Drugs is a good point, it could be drugs.
- Priya: But what drugs would need to be refrigerated? That's what I was thinking, I was like maybe it's weed or something.
- Leila: I don't know.
- Priya: Like why would you freak out over it being out of the fridge for short amount of time?
- Robin: Urine sample is a very good shout producer Jo, and also really enjoying the question she's put in the chat of spunk?
- Priya: Spunk?

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Leila: Yeah I don't...

Robin: Always good to see in a chat [laughs] Always good to see in any group chat.

Leila: It could be like, he could be a sperm donor like an underground one and trying to do that.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: That's not how it works but.

Robin: Olives. Stones.

Priya: It indicates the box has been there a while though. So why wouldn't you?

Leila: Yeah, no you'd have to...

Priya: Unless it's someone else's spunk that he's storing?

Leila: Jason's spunk.

Robin: Jason's.

Priya: Jason's! 'Jason' in quotation marks.

Leila: I really hate that we don't know what's inside. I mean yes it's not olives, it's just not olives.

Priya: It's not olives no, it's definitely not olives.

Leila: Olives don't need to be refrigerated either, they don't need to be.

Priya: Also they've been pickled.

Leila: Yeah exactly so what's the ?

Priya: That is an act of preserving olives so it would completely fine for them to be at room temperature.

Leila: What about crystal meth? Isn't that one...

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Priya: I don't know if it needs to be refrigerated.

Robin: Crystal meth Leila.

Priya: Go on.

Robin: Yeah I'm OK personally, I'm doing a podcast I'm fine, thank you though.

Leila: No [laughs] anyone? Yeah. I'm just trying to think what else it could?

Priya: I don't think drugs. I think...

Robin: I think a medical sample of some sort.

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: Piss. Shit. Semen.

Priya: It's some sort of biological.

Leila: Shit. Just like a stool. One of Jason's stools.

Robin: Egg.

Priya: Oh. I think body parts.

Robin: Pfizer. It's the Pfizer vaccine.

Priya: Sure.

Leila: I think that I feel so sad that this person thinks they are being wrong.

Robin: It's the final line that really makes me sad.

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: 'He usually doesn't get this mad unless I've done something wrong'. Fuck me that's bleak.

Priya: Oh baby.

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Leila: Have I messed up? I think I have.

Priya: Leave him. Leave him and his box of organs.

Robin: Yeah [laughs] Yeah his weird freaky metal box of refrigerated treats.

Leila: Could it be one of those little aliens that you rub together and they can give birth?

Priya: [Laughs] Like the slime?

Leila: Yeah with the slime [laughs].

Priya: He's like 'She's gestating, she needs to be refrigerated'.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.

Priya: Any of you, if your partner brought back a box and said 'This belongs to a friend but it would be rude for you to look in it'.

Leila: I would open it.

Priya: You? Yeah I mean I wouldn't ever allow that conversation to be dropped.

Robin: I'd burn it straightaway.

Priya: Because it's cursed.

Robin: Kitchen blowtorch straightaway. Let's heat this fucker up.

Leila: I'd be saying 'Show it to me then'. I'd say 'Show it to me'.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: I would not stop until.

Priya: Show me the olives.

Leila: Yeah show me the olives.

Priya: Show me the olives! Show me the olives!

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- Robin: Who is Jason and why does he have olives?
- Leila: It is rude, well in that case Jason can have his own fuckin' fridge.
- Priya: Yeah.
- Robin: Yeah.
- Leila: Why does it need to be in his fridge? This is not olives.
- Robin: This is 100% not olives. It's not olives.
- Priya: No it's not olives.
- Robin: And there is no Jason.
- Leila: What a weird lie to make up. Just say it's a sample. Say you're going to go see Gillian McKeith. Say it's you know.
- Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.
- Priya: It's rude to look in the box because it would be rude to touch someone else's stuff. It would be rude to touch someone else's kidney. He's not wrong.
- Robin: Yeah this is 100% Gwyneth Paltrow's head.
- Priya: [Laughs] Oh no.
- Leila: Gwyneth Paltrow's head [laughs].
- Robin: Is she in Seven? Is that the whole thing? Is it?
- Priya: Yeah, yeah, yeah, I understand the reference you're making.
- Robin: I've not seen the film. [Laughs] What's Seven? I am really hoping there's another update but I think that Jo is either waiting for it superbly or there is not one.
- Leila: I've had four texts from my girlfriends that say, my girlfriends, my girlfriend [laughs].

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Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: Four texts from my one girlfriend, just to clarify.

Robin: Don't touch my fucking olives.

Leila: Yeah don't touch my, no. 100% it's meth. Some people like to keep their meth in the fridge, they think it helps quality. I don't know how she knows this. And I'm going to go and check my fridge for metal boxes any second now.

Priya: Oh!

Leila: Because she's convinced that it's meth.

Robin: That's amazing.

Priya: OK.

Leila: I hate this. I hate.

Robin: I hate that we don't know the answer.

Leila: All I want to know is what's inside this fucking.

Priya: Should we change the format of this podcast so that it's an investigative podcast where we try and figure out what's in this box?

Leila: Yes.

Robin: I would love that.

Leila: OK there are edits, OK go, go, go, go, go.

Robin: Oh Jo! You absolute olive hoarder.

Leila: I'm worried she's written these just to calm us down.

Priya: [Laughs] Because we tried to change the format of the podcast.

Robin: Legally that's too much work. Leila.

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Leila: OK yes. 'Edit- First of all yes, I am aware that darling husband is acting overprotective of this box but he always acts like that whenever someone asks him to keep an item safe, like furniture or car parts.'

Robin: Oh he's such like a low level mafia schmuck isn't he?

Leila: Yeah shady, shady, shady, shady.

Priya: Mm hmm.

Leila: 'And second of all, no I haven't seen those olives myself and haven't opened the box because I didn't think I'd even have to. But darling husband tends to be overprotective of his friends belongings so I didn't give it much thought. Because many were wondering, yes I unplug the fridge before cleaning out'. [Laughs] OK.

Robin: [Laughs hysterically]

And to give some info, the metal box does look like a container of some sort but darling husband calls it box so I didn't think it's much different.' I don't know what that means.

Robin: Yeah.

- Leila: Yeah.
- Robin: I think when you're hoarding lots of mafia belongings then you should turn it off.
- Priya: There's a lot of blood on the inside of that fridge.
- Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah. This guy is absolutely.
- Priya: She's not the asshole, she needs to ask more questions.
- Robin: But he's a bad criminal.
- Leila: Yeah he is.
- Priya: Yeah he's not good at it.
- Robin: You know what I mean like you see all these mafia movies but you never see the story of the wife who has to put up with the shit of the really bad criminal [laughs].
- Leila: No. Yeah that's never in it.
- Priya: Olives are such a bad lie. I can't cope.
- Leila: Olives.
- Robin: Hey! It's the pizza in there! Like come on man, like [laughs].

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Priya: It's like a mafia guy showing up with a Tommy gun in a violin case and then insisting the violin case is full of olives. It's that level of none of it makes sense.

Leila: Yeah [laughs]

Robin: Make sure you put those olives in the fridge, yeah.

Leila: Yeah.

Robin: Christ!

Priya: She's not the asshole.

Robin: She's not the asshole but that could be a podcast in itself.

Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Yes I think so.

Priya: Oh to be a fly on the wall in this marriage.

Leila: Watch this be a documentary.

Robin: One of our many, many spin-offs. 100%.

Leila: That's not our remit is it really?

Robin: Yeah it's certainly not another Little Wander podcast.

Priya: No, no, we don't deal with body parts in the fridge.

Leila: No, no, no, no, no.

Robin: Not yet mate.

Priya: [Laughs]

[Here to Judge Interim Music]

Robin: 'Am I the asshole for refusing to flush the toilet when I pee? This is so weird I know lol but it will be short and to the point. Anyway I pee a lot and I think it's incredible

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waste to flush the toilet every time you pee. To me doing that is the weird thing.'

Leila: [Laughs]The weird thing.

Robin: 'It's completely normal for me to leave my pee in the toilet'. Is the weird thing. There's only one, and that is it. 'It's completely normal for me to just leave my pee in the toilet and really only flush for poo. I don't see the issue with this but my boyfriend hates it. He says it's absolutely disgusting and I act like an animal doing that. And he shouldn't be subjected to my bodily fluids just because I 'want to be a cheapskate' I don't know, I can see his point I guess but honestly I don't really see the issue, plus it's my house. - Leila: Yeah oh my god yeah. Yeah.
- Robin: I think there's a colour gradient...

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Priya: Yeah.

Leila: Yeah.

Robin: ...on when is acceptable to do it.

Priya: Yeah I completely agree.

Robin: And anything less than, I'm just trying to think on a sort of Dulux wall chart.

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: Or like the sort of juices or liquids.

Leila: Look anything that's yellow...

Robin: Uh chicken stock [laughs].

Priya: Yeah exactly chicken stock.

Leila: Ugh. Anything that's not clear and like...

Priya: Oh yeah.

Leila: ...if it's got a yellow tint flush it, just be, just do it. But if it's not then I think it's fine.

Robin: Shall we take in a break in the podcast where we can all flush?

Priya: [Laughs]

Leila: Yeah.

Priya: We all have three days worth of pees in there in fairness so yeah, yeah, yeah.

Leila: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Robin: That is one moment because occasionally, my son has the personal space of a drunk uncle on a stag do. Where he will just sort of burst 'I need a wee!' and he'll burst open the door when I'm doing anything in there. And if I'm say going for number twos I will need to stand up for him so that he can wee.

Leila: Oh my god.

Robin: And he is just in control of the house.

Leila: You're such a good dad, definitely [laughs].

Robin: What's the alternative? Either he pisses himself or he pisses on me. Like.

Leila: Yeah I really think that literal half a shit out of your body just standing.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah. Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Priya: Like those other sacrifices you have to make.

Robin: The things you do for children. Yeah, yeah, yeah exactly. This is not what they tell you during antenatal classes, the things you'll do for your children.

Leila: No.

Priya: [Laughs]

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Leila: Where did you learn this technique? What is it called? No um.

Robin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah. It's called pinching it off and it is not a good technique.

Leila: [Laughs]

Robin: But like occasionally [laughs] he goes into the bathroom when I was having a shower and at one point I just weed in the shower. - Priya: I need to leave.
- Robin: To have a shower.
- Leila: And I remember distinctly trying and not being able to like as if my body would be like, do you know what I mean if you need to pee.
- Robin: Conditioned yeah.
- Leila: Yeah and I had to just like visualise in my head and then I did it and I was like wow. And I've never been back since.
- Priya: OK. A revelation.
- Leila: Yeah it really was, it was a proper revelation that.
- Priya: I will say I clean my shower more often than I think more people do as a result of this. Like I wipe down my shower after every use.
- Leila: Yes, also same.
- Priya: Yeah OK.
- Leila: You're not special.
- Robin: Do you unplug the fridge and then...
- Priya: [Laughs]

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Robin: [Laughs]

Leila: I also clean my shower.

Priya: Thank you for constantly keeping me humble.

Leila: Yeah [laughs] I think I clean more because I, I love that [laughs].

Priya: Yeah because I piss everywhere [laughs].

Leila: I love that logic [laugh] Like yeah do you know what keeps me really productive? I just shit all over the walls and then I clean my house.

Robin: I change my bathroom tiles once a month.

Priya: Yeah.

Robin: I grout them out and I get a tiler to relay them because of the amount of shit and piss that I throw on them.
